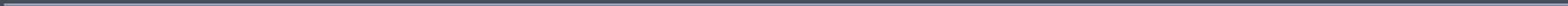

Motor vehicle incidents are the leading cause of traumatic workplace fatalities in B.C.

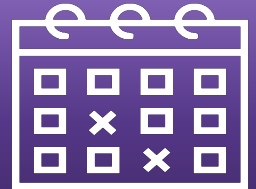

Motor vehicle incidents cost more

Staggering consequences for people and businesses

	All Claims	MVI Claims	Ratio
Claims costs	\$21,633	\$46,517	215%
Duration	59 days	93 days	158%

Occupational safety requirements

Workplace: where a worker is engaged

- Vehicle used for work is a workplace
- Includes company owned or employee owned



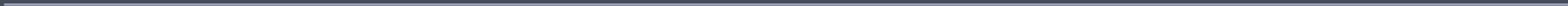

Case Study: What worked for me

Ensuring no harm comes to:

- Financial obligations
- Legal responsibilities
- Moral/ethical duties



What could possibly go wrong?

- Encounters with wildlife
- Musculo-skeletal injuries
- Slip, trips and falls



What could possibly go wrong?

Greatest risk = motor vehicle crash!



Focus on crash risks

Hazard	Probability	Severity	Ranking
Collision with log truck or another large vehicle	Low	High	2
Get stuck in mud, break down, flat tire	Medium	Low	3
Drive off road because of fatigue	Medium	High	1

Road safety risk assessments

RiskCheck				
Hazard Category	Hazard/Contributing factor	Probability	Severity	Risk Ranking
Driver	Collision with log truck or another large vehicle	Low	High	Medium
Vehicle	Get stuck in mud, break down, flat tire	Medium	Low	Low
Driver	Drive off road because of fatigue	Medium	High	High

Fit for purpose

Is the vehicle designed and built for the purposes it will be used for?



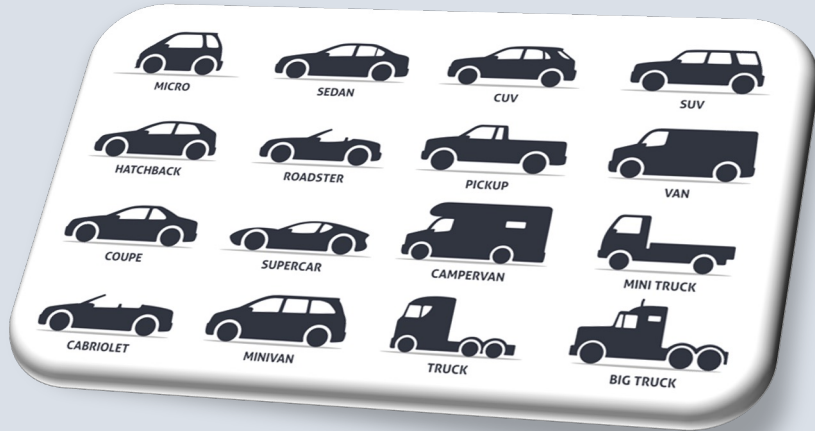
Regular inspections and maintenance



Vehicle-related hazards are easiest to manage

Inspections plus maintenance = the most inexpensive, reliable risk reduction strategy

Getting ready to go

Verify driver qualifications

Check driver's licence

- Date of issue
- Expiry date
- Class
- Driver's abstract



Driver orientations

- Orient driver to vehicle and expectations
- Show where controls are and how to operate
- Explain equipment
- Vehicle inspection demonstration



Ride-along assessments

Observe driver skills, attitudes and behaviours

- Safe vehicle operation
- Limitations to assignments
- Additional training requirements

Confirm employees are legally authorized to drive

Evaluate driver skills and behaviours

Driver Orientation Checklist

Provide supervision

Manage routes, schedules, and expectations

- Have a check-in process
- Reliable communications are essential
